In January 2018, the NOBEL Consortium, an EU funded H2020 project coordinated by the European Technology Platform on Nanomedicine (ETPN), organized a workshop "Creating a meta-roadmap" with the aim to define trends in healthtech, including gaps, potential synergies among technologies and potential cross technologies. I attended this workshop on behalf of the ESB and committed to further collaborate with the initiative, representing the interests of the ESB members and keeping them informed about relevant developments regarding, for example, future EC funding of biomaterials research and development.

The preparations for the next annual ESB conference that will take place September 9-13 2018 in Maastricht, the Netherlands, are in full swing. The organizing committee has received over 900 abstracts and is currently developing an exciting scientific and social programme. A part of the programme are two special sessions co-organized with our sister societies, the Canadian Society for Biomaterials and the Korean Society for Biomaterials.
