Communication

As we will not have our ESB annual conference this year, we have taken a series of actions that, we hope, will make our presence felt to all our members particularly in relation to the celebration of the ESB 40th Anniversary.

The ESB 40th Anniversary Torch. This is an initiative that will see the ESB supporting the costs of the plenary lectures at the conferences of some of our Affiliated Societies. So far, the Society from Germany, Italy and The Netherlands took this opportunity. We invite the Presidents of the other societies to consider this offer for their annual event.

The ESB 40th Anniversary Lecture. We secured a slot at the WBC 2016 for the delivery of our anniversary lecture that will be delivered by the winner of the ESB International Award who this year is Prof Michael Sefton, Canada.

The Acta Materialia Gold Medal. The history of our Society will also be celebrated through the lecture delivered by Prof Klaas de Groot as he receives the prestigious Acta Materialia Gold Medal. With his lecture Prof de Groot will give us more time to treasure our history and the excellence of the research in Europe.

Exhibition Space and Celebratory Gadget. At the WBC2016 our Society will ensure a constant presence to all our members through an exhibition space. Thanks to the leadership of our Communication Officer, Prof Carlos Rodriguez-Cabello we have commissioned the production of a celebratory gadget (to wet your appetite we will not reveal it until the start of the congress!). Indeed, the whole booth will be dedicated to our history. If you are in Montreal do not miss it!

In any case, we will do our best to make sure that this special celebratory gadget will reach as many ESB friends as possible.

Innovation

Technopreneurship Scheme. As previously announced, together the INGENIO research team (Valencia, Spain) and through the leadership of our Industry Liaison Officer, Prof Peter Dubruel, we have now finalized the questionnaire that will be circulated to you all in the next few weeks through national societies for biomaterials and other national contact points. The success of this initiative depends on you and your kind response to the questions. The data collected will be included in a final report not only assessing the state-of-the-art in research translation in our field but also aiming at offering a mapping of relevant, highly-specialised facilities and expertise across Europe. For the first time, we will give a critical assessment of the state of translation in our continent in the field of biomaterials and a glance of the strength of our scientific and industrial communities. We hope this document will be a very valuable tool for

stakeholders seeking specific support. This, we believe, will promote your technopreneurship by enhancing the opportunities for research and service. The success of this initiative depends on you and your kind response to the questions. Please watch this space!
